Despite their best efforts in reaching out to the human community, especially its socalled scientists, Things are tragically still the victims of widespread prejudice, discrimination and misunderstanding.


And flamethrowers. Always the flamethrowers.


- Keep an open mind about the potential social, technological and economic benefits of contact with Things.


Remember, the first step toward peace is to live without fear. Fear of the Things.
